More than 90% of all researcher feel sick, loose data, or suffer from stress, violence and delinquency while conducting fieldwork or data collection.

Research participants, organizations, and collaborators also highly impacted and at risk.

Research quality, legitimacy and viability highly affected.

Universities and research centres have a duty of care but struggle to fulfill that responsibility.

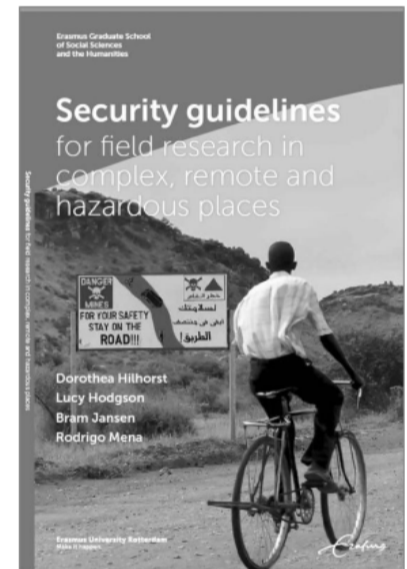

This course "has been major game-changer in our work", shares the convener of a MA program.

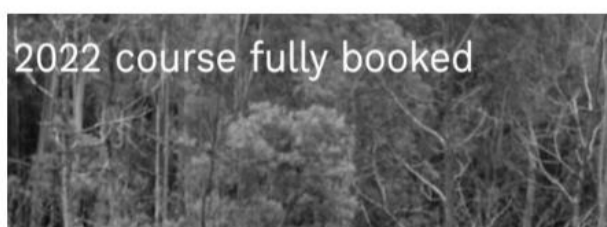
